The Re-connection Direction

Recently myself and Mr. Mak Chi Ho, the Headmaster of St. Paul's College Primary School, paid a visit to the USA and Canada to help re-connect with our alumni and friends in North America. We were both struck by the sincerity and eagerness of our alumni to play a part in our College's development, and are eager for news of their classmates and friends. These are the ties that bind us together, and it was an inspiration for us to see the depth of feeling of our alumni for their alma mater. Now it is our duty to ensure that we keep our overseas alumni not only in our hearts, but also up to date with all the happenings at the College using advances in technology to do so.

Both the College and the Primary School have intensely loyal alumni following, but distance often make the direct personal connection more challenging for all concerned. In fact many of the alumni were also students of Mr. Mak and myself in the past, which made our re-unions all the more enjoyable. We were able to fill in the alumni and family groups on recent developments and future plans. In the days of social media, contact can now be almost instantaneous, but we believe that the personal touch of face-to-face meetings give meaning to the belief that 'Once a

Paulian, Always a Paulian'. The 're-connection direction' trip was ably assisted by Mr. Tenny Doone ('68) who helped set up the Californian side, with visits to Vancouver and San Francisco. In each venue, we both felt that once we have re-ignited the spark, we need to keep the fire of unity burning.

Similarly, the greetings and hearty welcomes from the Ontario Alumni Association were genuine and joyful. We were treated to a number of excellent gatherings, usually over meals, where the alumni could get a clear sense of the vision and direction of the College and Primary School.

Our aim of reconnecting with our loyal alumni was achieved, but our visit will only be a long term success if these connections are kept strong into the future. We sincerely ask that fellow alumni help us to make connections with the overseas brothers with whom we have lost contact. You may be a long way from Bonham Road, but you are always with us in spirit.

Remaking SPC for the next generation

You will notice an innovative and attractive new section in your copy of 'News from St. Paul's', about the School Enhancement Project. This new section is the brainchild of the Fundraising Committee. I could not be more appreciative of the way in which our alumni have pitched in and jump-started the School Enhancement. Dr. Ian Chan has been a powerful force in galvanizing the alumni to new heights in assisting the school, and the St. Paul's College Foundation is a wellspring of ideas to keep the project moving forward. We are now almost at the completion of Campaign One, and I am feeling blessed by the support of the entire College community in moving this scheme forward. Sometimes, when I see all of the good work going on that College even without this major renovation, I question whether we actually need such a project. As soon as I do so, I look at the website's School Enhancement projections, and I think about the future of the College, and President Obama's call to action: 'If not us, who? If not now, when?' Our boys, both now and in the future, deserve the best opportunity to reach their potential, and it is our duty and privilege to work towards providing the hardware and software for them to do so.

Our People, Our Strength

Of course, it is not buildings that make the College ultimately; it's the people who teach and study here. I am particularly proud of all the subject teams who have given their time and effort to revamp the curriculum in line with best global practices. It is not easy to do so - we have had teacher teams, especially in science, participating with other leading Hong Kong schools in examining changing and refining the curriculum for an enquiry based learning approach at MIT in the United States. Our departments of Integrated Humanities and English have just returned from an enlightening developmental conference in Melbourne, Australia, surrounded by global leaders in curriculum development. In fact, teachers at SPC spend a great deal of time in becoming more skilled at their vocation, and bringing their enthusiasm and expertise in education to our students.

It hardly seems possible that we are coming to the end of another school year. The themes of Reconnection, Building, and Growing Together are ones which are foremost in my mind as we move towards the end of the year. Most of all, I want to express my deepest gratitude to all of you who worked to make SPC what it is. While the school year 2018-2019 may be drawing to a close, I see a bright future ahead in 2019-2020 and beyond.

School Enhancement Project

The School Enhancement Project aims to greatly improve the academic and cultural atmosphere of the campus, and strengthen the interaction of students by meeting the needs of modern teaching development. It is divided into four Campaigns which will cost at least \$400 million. Below is an update on the enhancement progress:

Message from the Chairman of the School Enhancement Project Fundraising Committee

Dear Fellow Alumni,

The School Enhancement Project is well underway. To refresh your memory, the Project has four distinct Campaigns. Campaign One is to expand the classroom space to accommodate a more interactive approach of teaching. The total budget for this Campaign is \$90 million and I am happy to let you know that it has come to a successful conclusion. The College Council contributed \$30 million, the Fundraising Committee raised \$30 million, which was matched 1:1 from a generous anonymous alumni for the remaining \$30 million. I would like to thank our Principal, Dennis Yuen, his team and many alumni who have put in a lot of effort to make it happen.

The Second Campaign covers the construction of a new entrance/foyer along Bonham Road, the conversion of the swimming pool into a heated 5-lane indoor pool, the incorporation of state-of-the-art technology with multi-purpose functions for the library and the relocation of administrative offices. In order to minimize disturbance to the students when the Second Campaign begins, it is hoped that heavy construction works can be done during the coming summer vacation. To kickoff this Campaign, an additional \$30 million dollars have to be raised before the end of June as seed money. The total budget for this Campaign is \$86 million. Through hard work and strong support of the St. Paul's community, I believe it is achievable. Campaign Two is scheduled to be completed in December 2020, in time for the celebration of the School 170th Anniversary.

The Third Campaign focuses on the enhancement of Music facilities and the Final Campaign will see improvements for Sports training. These projects' commencements hinge on the success of fundraising.

I want to point out and emphasize that the objective of the Fundraising Campaigns go beyond the raising of capital for enhancements of the School. It is also an opportunity for the school to strengthen its relationships with stakeholders of SPC. Another measure of a successful campaign by a school is the rate of participation by its alumni. For instance, a strong Ivy League university in the US have a typical participation rate of 60+% for their annual giving. It is an indicator of how much care their alumni have for the school. Therefore, I urge all our alumni to make a contribution, no matter what the amount is.

I hope I can bring more good news to you with regards to the fundraising in the near future.

Message from the Chairman of the Special Project Committee

從校董會決定展開般舍道校舍擴建計劃以來，好榮幸能夠與一班校長和老師共事，堅持學校的教育理念，配合學校的未來發展方針，從草擬發展規模、設施設備、到聘用專業顧問團隊，過程中不斷優化設計、控制成本、兼顧施工時對師生教學、安全、環境因素做成的不便影響等等。慶幸校內有不同崗位的同事和老師，為項目傾力付出，但從中對各人的人生歷練，也提供了難得的學習機會和提升。

隨著緊張的一年多，第一期工程已接近尾聲，所有教學課室在今次工程得以擴大了面積約30%，為不同之教學討論學習模式，提供了無數的可能性和靈活性；設施也隨著科技的發展得以讓教學環境改善良多。按已定計劃，我們馬上要展開第二期工程，內容包括在現有之室外游泳池改為室內恆溫池外，在上蓋加建一個開闊的學校入口大堂，同時亦可作為一個展覽場地，不時展示同學在音、體、藝各樣之成就；這該是學校與社區聯繫接觸的第一個平台。第二期工程內容還包括新建圖書館及藝術展廊等，部份工程預計在170周年校慶時落成使用。

雖然前面仍有很多技術、規範、成本及安全問題，但這些我們都有信心可隨著大家的努力迎刃而解。一直以來，有很多校友都向我自動請纓，希望能參與到工程項目來，所以我們正積極籌組一些工程業餘顧問及監察小組，可盡量吸納各方的資源，聽取各方之意見，集合大家的力量，解決設計施工上之困難外，亦可為將來新校舍新設施之運作，如何做到更環保，更有效而集思廣益，做出貢獻。

當然，萬事具備，只欠東風。「學校優化工作」項目，目標遠大，但所需資源亦不少，通過「籌款小組」陳幼南主席及其團隊，再加上「學校籌款基金會」各人之努力，在經過短短3個月以來之工作及號召，已籌得近1億元。當然，距離整個項目的目標仍需要大家校友出錢出力，為我們的母校，為以後的莘莘學子，為我們「百年大樹的種子」，一起努力灌溉和栽種吧！

Event Highlights

Activity Week 2019

The Activity Week, initiated by the Other Learning Experiences (OLE) Team, was held from 15 April 2019 to 18 April 2019. All F.1 to F.4 students had the opportunity to 'jump outside the classroom' and experienced more than 80 different activities, including Community Experiences, Arts, Sports and STEM programmes. Learning was with no boundary, nearly a hundred of students have participated in overseas programmes to New Zealand, Los Angeles, Singapore, Beijing and Tianjin and Taichung.

The school has cooperated with many organizations to provide diverse learning experiences for our students. Through Footstep Angel, students understood more about the issues of food wastage and elderly poverty in Hong Kong. Two lifesaving programmes, the first-aid programme ran by the Hong Kong Red Cross for F.1 students and the CPR workshop conducted by the Fire Services Department for F.3 students not only enriched the students with the basic principles, but also hands-on practice on treating different types of injuries.

The OLE Team, in collaboration with the Integrated Humanities Department, the Physical Education Department, the Visual Arts Department and the STEM Team, offered a wide array of educational programmes on 18 April. Prior to the day of wonderful activities, students made their activity choice through the OLE online platform. The activities provided students with learning opportunities beyond the classroom and fostered their interest in the new experiences.

The Activity Week also culminated with the Student-led Programme, where F.2 and F.3 students gained a variety of learning experiences. It all started last December when each class formed an organizing committee and designed a class-based activity under the guidance of their Form teachers and the OLE Team. Through active participation in the organization of the activities, students developed communication, collaboration and leadership skills. The programmes organized by our students included Bakery Class, Beach Cleaning, Archery Tag and Kin-ball.

The Activity Week was well-received by our student and parents and its success lay upon the support from all stake holders of our school.

The University of Pittsburgh, where Dr. Fu serves as the David Silver Professor and Chair of the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, has recently renamed a medical building after him.

The UPMC Freddie Fu Sports Medicine Centre is the new name given to the medical building located on the campus of the UPMC Rooney Sports Complex.

The newly-renamed medical center stands as a testament to Dr. Fu's 32 years of dedicated and distinguished medical service, not only to the university community but also to the local Pittsburgh community, where many athletes, from high school students to Olympic champions, have benefited from the UPMC Sports Medicine Program founded by Dr. Fu himself in 1986.

The honour adds to Dr. Fu's long list of accolades and achievements. Notably in 2016, the city of Pittsburgh dedicated 13th September as Dr. Freddie Fu Day in honour of his induction into the American Orthopaedic Society (AOSSM) Hall of Fame. He also gained global fame in 2017 as the surgeon who saved the career of football star Zlatan Ibrahimovic from a severe knee injury.
